Day 1 - Sunday - North Berwick Golf Club (Est. 1832) Par: 71 Men / 74 Ladies

Length: Blue Tees 6,458 yards / White Tees 6,101 yards / Ladies Tees 5,749 yards

Arrive Glasgow Airport and travel to Gullane in East Lothian area. Golf has been played over the historic West Links course since the 17th century, and we continue to play over the same piece of land as they did back then. With breathtaking views of the Firth of Forth and islands of Bass Rock, Craigleith, Lamb and Fidra, as well as the town of North Berwick itself, there are few places better in the world to play golf! A true championship links course, having hosted Final Qualifying for The Open Championship and both Gentlemen and Ladies Amateur Championships.

Day 2 - Monday - Gullane Golf Club No.1 (Est. 1882) Par: 71 Men / 74 Ladies

Length: Blue Tees 6,873 yards / White Tees 6,583 yards / Ladies Tees 5,903 yards

Golf has been played over the links at Gullane for more than 350 years. Today, Gullane Golf Club is one of Scotland's most prestigious member clubs, mixing the finest tradition with some of the most admired natural links land in the world. It is carved into the ancient links turf with pot bunkers, wispy grasses and smooth-running greens is a unique challenge for the serious golfer. On the PGA Website, the course was voted one of the Most Picturesque Golf Spots in 5th place in the World in a list that includes Augusta National and Pebble Beach.

Day 3 - Tuesday - Turnberry (Ailsa) Golf Club (Est. 1906) Par: 71 Men / 74 Ladies

Length: Blue Tees 7,489 yards / White Tees 6,511 yards / Ladies Tees 5,406 yards

Set alongside the glorious Ayrshire coastline, with Arran and Ailsa Craig as a stunning backdrop, it is one of the finest golfing destinations in the world. Named after the third Marquess of Ailsa, who owned the land on which it was built, the Ailsa is one of the world's most loved golf courses and has had the privilege of hosting the Open Championship four times, including the unforgettable 1977 Duel in the Sun. In 2014 famed golf course architects Mackenzie &



Ebert started and have since completed a meticulous historic study and modern day review of the Ailsa course, creating a true masterpiece.

Day 4 - Wednesday - Turnberry (King Robert the Bruce) GC (Est. 1906) Par: 72 Men & Ladies

Length: Blue Tees 7,203 yards / White Tees 6,594 yards / Ladies Tees 5,767 yards

Set alongside the glorious Ayrshire coastline, with Arran and Ailsa Craig as a stunning backdrop, it is one of the finest golfing destinations in the world. Many people are unaware of the fact that the iconic lighthouse, which was built by the family of celebrated author, Robert Louis Stevenson, is

situated amongst the ruins of Turnberry Castle. It was in this medieval castle that King Robert the Bruce was born in July 1274. Turnberry is steeped in a strong history, leading us to name our new golf course after the King of Scotland, Robert the Bruce, the historical warrior who led Scotland to claim its right as an independent country in the Battle of Bannockburn in June 1314. Martin Ebert, who was the architect responsible for the reborn Ailsa, was commissioned once more to create a world-class golf experience, which thrills golfers of all abilities.

Day 5 - Thursday - Royal Troon Golf Club (Est. 1878) Par: 71 Men / 75 Ladies

Length: Blue Tees 7,208 yards / White Tees 6,632 yards / Ladies Tees 6,108 yards

Originally designed by George Strath and Willie Fernie, In 1923 James Braid remodelled the course before it hosted its first Open Championship to what it is today. Royal Troon Golf Club proudly

hosted The 145th Open Championship in July of 2016, the famous duel between Phil Michelson and Henrik Stenson. It was the ninth occasion The Open had been held at Troon. Royal Troon is home to both the longest and shortest holes in Open Championship golf. Regarded as one of the top holes in the world, the par-3 8th hole ("Postage Stamp") measures a scant 123 yards Two holes earlier, the par-5 6th ("Turnberry") extends to a lengthy 601 yards. A magnificent course in a magnificent setting.

Day 6 - Friday - Prestwick GC @ (Est. 1851) Par: 71 Men / 74 Ladies

Length: Blue Tees 6,908 yards / White Tees 6,551 yards / Ladies Tees 5,571 yards

Designed by Old Tom Morris, Prestwick Golf Club, the Birthplace of the Open Championship in 1860, is situated on a stretch of golfing terrain unrivalled in the world. The last and 24th Open

Championship at Prestwick was held 65 years later in 1925. The course's cramped layout does make hosting of events with large galleries highly problematic and thus the Open has not since been held their, although the course's challenge remains intact to test the modern generation of players. With its unrivalled history, charismatic course and warm welcome, there are few places like it in the world of golf.

Day 7 - Saturday - Western Gailes Golf Club (Est. 1897) Par: 71 Mens & Ladies

Length: Blue Tees 7,014 yards / White Tees 6,640 yards / Ladies Tees 5,441 yards

Regarded by many as the hidden gem of Scottish links, it is a course that we believe should be in every golfer's "must play" list. The course is situated between the railway and the sea, so typical of the classic Ayrshire links courses, with both being very much in play for the errant golfer. It is also special amongst seaside courses that are no more than two holes wide, in having its clubhouse



in a more or less central position leaving seven holes to the north and eleven to the south. The course is never other than an excellent test of true links golf.
